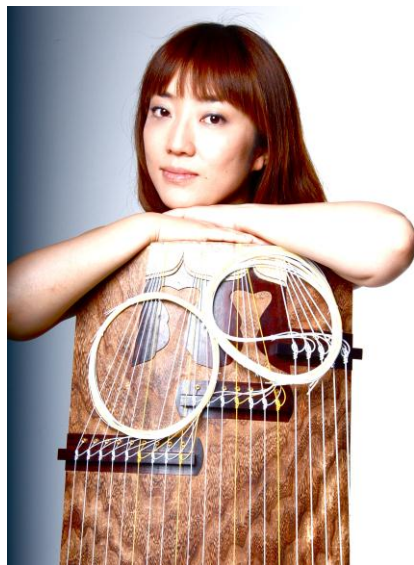

She also studied computer music at computer music lab when she was attending Keio University. As well as extensive performance in Japan, in 2002, she moved to New York, she has appeared on well known venues such as Apollo sound stage Joe's pub and held her concert at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie, her first CD, Beginning of a Journey, featuring her own compositions, was released in 2009. Yumi appeared as the soloist for the world premiere of Koto Concerto: Genji, by composer Daron Hagen in NYC, DC and with the Orchestra of the Swan in UK, and she will play this Concerto at World Financial Center on the May 5th. She will be appeared in the Chelsea Music Festival, Concerts in Japan and many others. She has received great concert review several times in New York Times, The Washington Post and so on.
